With the new elected presidency and the start of the new programming period, the start of this year has been a busy one.

Networking and policy-making being our priority now, we have started making our way into influencing the drafting of the future policies linked to rural development. Since January, we have taken an active role within the CAP network's Assembly and its LEADER subgroup, initiated discussions with MEPs and Commissioners to make our voices heard regarding the future of LEADER beyond 2027, as well as started drafting a contribution on added-value for the CAP Evaluation Helpdesk. We want to remain proactive in the beginning of this new programming period and make proposals in favour of a simplified and locally rooted rural development policy post-27. For this, we will engage LAGs within our members networks throughout the next two years.

I am happy to announce that within this, and in the spirit of continuously spread the LEADER approach, we have welcomed a new honorary member within ELARD yesterday: the Association of Rural Municipalities of Ukraine. Following our last General Assembly where members agreed to start cooperation with rural Urkaine, I went to Kiev and had the opportunity to meet with Ivan Slobodianyk, CEO of the association. They are familiar with the Leader approach and wish to implement it their process of pre-accession to the EU. Let's share our experience with them!




